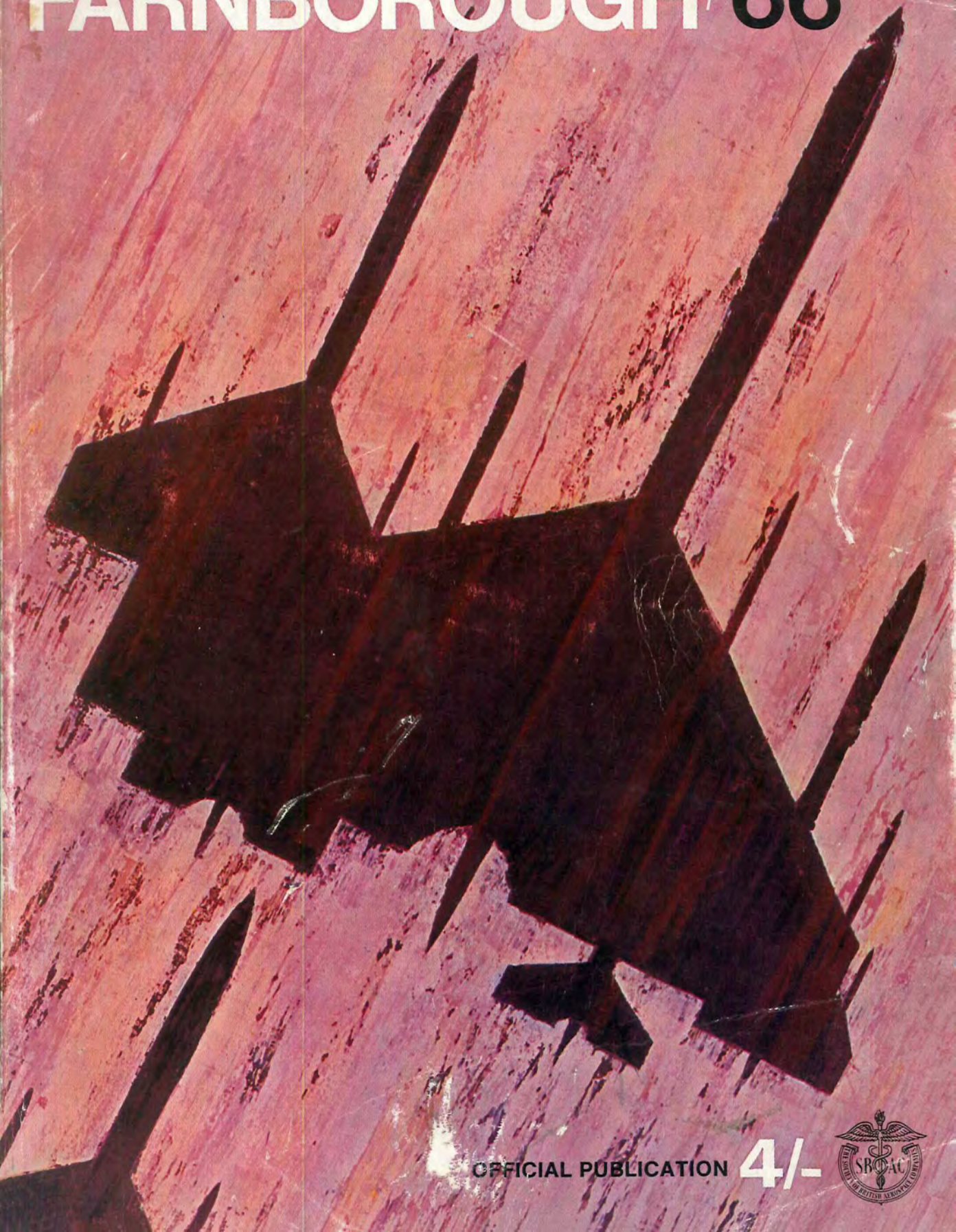

THIS YEAR'S EXHIBITION AND FLYING DISPLAY will include the aircraft, engines and equipment with which British aerospace firms expect to achieve a record volume of exports in 1966, the fiftieth anniversary of the Society. The exhibition will also include abundant evidence of an industry geared to meet the demands of the future—both military and civil—ranging from the smaller executive aircraft to the sophisticated supersonic transport with engines and equipment to match; the flying display will also include for the first time aircraft manufactured in Europe and containing a substantial amount of British equipment.


